These topics include land and climate, history, the flag, population, language, religion, general attitudes, personal appearance, greetings, gestures, food, lifestyle, society, and government. In this unit, students are directed to learn specifically about Bolivian decorations and politics. Short comprehension quizzes follow each culture activity.

Students are also introduced to the Sancho and Bolsa story where they can further hear, read, and listen to Spanish words within the context of the story told in English. Finally, students are given the challenge to use their newly acquired Spanish beyond the classroom environment. Students are assigned to report on their progress towards becoming life-long learners.

A multiple choice test is given to assess students' understanding of the vocabulary and grammar topics from this unit. They are also given an open-ended writing assignment in which they are asked to construct sentences using the present subjunctive tense.
